
Best Views

- · A touch-screen remote to control all equipment and lighting
- · Tiered seating with comfort and support
- Independent climate control for theater
- · Motorized curtains in front of screen
- A fiber-optic ceiling to create starry-sky effect
- Lighted aisles
- A grand threshold
- · Light fixtures that won't rattle when the sound gets loud
- Acoustical panels on walls
